


#### FINDING THE ENTRANCE

Genesis 4:1-7 (NLT2) <sup>1</sup> Now Adam had sexual relations with his wife, Eve, and she became pregnant. When she gave birth to Cain, she said, "With the LORD's help, I have produced a man!" <sup>2</sup> Later she gave birth to his brother and named him Abel. When they grew up, Abel became a shepherd, while Cain cultivated the ground.

<sup>3</sup> When it was time for the harvest, Cain presented some of his crops as a gift to the LORD. <sup>4</sup> Abel also brought a gift—the best of the firstborn lambs from his flock. The LORD accepted Abel and his gift, <sup>5</sup> but he did not accept Cain and his gift. This made Cain very angry, and he looked dejected.

<sup>6</sup> "Why are you so angry?" the LORD asked Cain. "Why do you look so dejected? <sup>7</sup> You will be accepted if you do what is right. But if you refuse to do what is right, then watch out! Sin is crouching at the door, eager to control you. But you must subdue it and be its master





**Common Entry Points** 1. Yielding to temptation James 1:13-15 (NKJV) <sup>13</sup> Let no one say when he is tempted, "I am tempted by God"; for God cannot be tempted by evil, nor does He Himself tempt anyone. <sup>14</sup> But each one is tempted when he is drawn away by his own desires and enticed.

<sup>15</sup> Then, when desire has conceived, it gives birth to sin; and sin, when it is full-grown, brings forth death.

**Common Entry Points** 2. False Beliefs: Common false beliefs are: I'm entitled to more. Rules don't apply to me. I'm bad – no good. If I'm not in control something bad will happen.

**Common Entry Points** 2. False Beliefs: Common false beliefs are: I'm stupid. I'm worthless. I'm good for nothing. I'll always fail no matter how hard I try.

**Common Entry Points** 2. False Beliefs: Common false beliefs are: I'll never measure up. My value is based on my performance. Whatever I do won't be good enough. God doesn't love me or really care.
